- v. Mutual / Mass copying
- vi. Smuggling-put, either blank or written, or smuggling in of answerbooks as copying material.
- vii. Smuggling-in blank or written answerbook and forging signature of the Jr. Supervisor thereon.
- viii. Interfering with or counterfeiting of University/Collage/Institution seal, or answer books or office stationary used in the examinations.
- ix. Insertion of currency notes in the answerbooks or attempting to bribe any of the persons connected with conduct of examinations.
- x. Impersonation at the University/College/Institution examination.
- xi. Revealing identity in any form in the answer written or in any other part of the answerbook by the student at the University or College or Institution examination.
- xii. Or any other similar act/s and/or omission/s which may be considered as unfair means by the competent authority.

The allocation of marks for the Internal Assessment and Semester End Examinations are as shown below:-

2. Question Paper Pattern for Periodical Class Test for Courses at PG Programmes

No specific question paper pattern for PG programmes. It may be finalized by the college proportionate to the nature of the programme/course.

Passing Standard

The learners to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate for each course where the course consists of Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination. The learners shall obtain minimum of 40% marks (i.e. 10 out of 25) in the Internal Assessment and 40% marks in Semester End Examination (i.e. 30 Out of 75) separately, to pass the course and minimum of Grade E, wherever applicable, to pass a particular semester. A learner will be said to have passed the course if the learner passes the Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination together.

Note : As per previous ordinance there will not be any internal examination for practicals.

Note : It is noted that the amended regulation 8435 is to be implemented to all Semesters i.e. Semester I to Semester Vi to all Undergraduate programmes, simultaneously, under faculty of Arts, Commerce and Science from the academic Year 2014-2015

WHAT IS NAAC ?

(i) NATIONAL ASSESSMENT AND ACCREDITATION COUNCIL (NAAC)

National Assessment and Accreditation Council, is an autonomous body which was established by the University Grants Commission in 1994. It was recommended by the National Policy of Education (POE) and the Programme of Action (POA) which laid emphasis on the quality of higher education in India. The major work of NAAC is to assess and accreditation the institutions of higher learning, universities and colleges or one or more of their units. The units include departments, schools, institutions, programmes, etc.

The NAAC is represented by educational administrators, policy makers and senior academicians from a cross-section of system of higher education.

General Council and Executive Committee forms the part of the functional aspects of NAAC.

Methodology of NAAC : NAAC introduced new methods by which the higher education institutions are assessed and accredited by a two-step approach.

Step 1 : The institutions are required to seek 'Institutional Eligibility for Quality Assessment (IEQA)'.

Step 2 : Assessment and accreditation of the institutes are based on grades. 'A', 'B', 'C' for accredited institutions; and 'D' for those which are not accredited.

Criteria of NAAC:

There are seven criteria for NAAC and they are

1. Curricular aspects
2. Teaching-learning and evaluation
3. Research, Consultancy and extension
4. Infrastructure and learning resources
5. Student support and progression
6. Governance and leadership
7. Innovative practices as the basis for its assessment procedure.

UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION; 2009

(Under Section 26(1) (9) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956)
E.1-16/2007 (CPP-II) dated 17th June , 2009.

Preamble -

To provide the healthy developments physically and psychologically, of all students in all higher education institutions, the University Grants Commission, brings forth this regulation.

1. Title commencement and applicability :-

These regulations shall be called the "UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009.

They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the official Gazette.

They shall apply to all the institutions coming within the definition of an University under subsection (f) of section (2) of the UGC, 1956.

2. Objectives :-

To prohibit any conduct by any student/s which causes annoyance, hardship or psychological harm, fear or apprehension to fresher or other student/s.

3. What constitutes Ragging :-

- a) Teasing, treating or handling by words spoken or written or an act.
- b) Rowdy or indisciplined activities.
- c) Asking to do any act which generates as sense of shame.
- d) Any act of physical abuse, sexual abuse etc.

4. Measures for prohibition of ragging at the institutional level :-

All institutions shall take all necessary and required measures to achieve the objective of eliminating ragging, within the institution or outside.

5. Measures for prevention of ragging at the institution level :-

- a) Public declaration that ragging is totally prohibited in the institution.
- b) Prospectus shall prominently print these regulations in full.
- c) Affidavit to sign by every applicant that he/she would not indulge in the ragging.
- d) Social behavioural pattern of applicant should be checked through L.C./T.C./Migration at the time of admission.
- e) Each institution shall tighten security, anti-ragging committee formation etc.
- f) Each institution shall give adequate publicity in institute in mass by mass media about law prohibiting ragging and the negative aspects of ragging.
